Yes that is one way.. Here is another:

I stumbled upon WildBit Viwer some days ago, after I nearly lost the hope to find a replacement for ACDSsee Classic.

Compared with other maybe 40 ACDSsee-like viewers which I tested recently, WildBit Viwer has some really strong points:

- 1) Is compact - I'm still the meaning that good programs fit on a floppy... the idea to separate the functions in 3 independent files is brilliant.
- 2) It's not obtrusive - keeps HD and registry clean
- 3) Is fast - the JPG decoder you are using is a real good one.
- 4) Supports Unicode Filenames - which is a feature that even the japanese ViX viewer doesn't (only Brennings/SlowView has it).
- 5) Has TIF (including multipage) support - useful for Fax viewing
- 6) Is portable - just copy an exe - hence can be burned on CD
- 7) Is stable
- 8) Doesn't require huge ressources

All these make a good foundation for a solid program which just needs a bit "polished". Congratulations.

I'm really wondering now why I didn't found it earlier - it would have saved me alot of time and trouble during last couple of years.

Now WildBit Viewer is set as my default viewer, and I'm giving it a try. But I know already it is the final choice.

Most laptops (and some desktops) can present a second display on a large screen or a projector. This allows you to give slideshow presentations to an audience. On most newer XP and Vista systems there are two dual (or multiple) screen modes available, cloned mode where the same display is shown by both projector and laptop screen, and extended desktop where the screens show different displays that lie side by side on a large imaginary desktop. With extended desktop you can display the slideshow on screen 2 whilst at the same time running a different program on screen 1, perhaps to display lecture notes or play music. A technical advantage over cloned mode is that the display resolutions and shapes can be different on the two screens, especially helpful when using a mixture of standard and wide screen equipment.

Wildbit Slideshow has several features that help you to use extended desktop. I gathered a few tips together here of things I found useful. Hope they may be of interest to you.

1. Options. In Options select Show Tray Icon and Launch as Maximised, and deselect Hide from Toolbar. When you next launch Slideshow you should see the Windows taskbar with a Slideshow button, and the System tray with a Slideshow icon.
2. Set up show as normal. Select either the Folder or the Custom Show to use and the image change and transition settings that you want.
3. Send to screen 2. You can move the show to screen 2 by clicking the Go To 2nd Monitor option on the toolbar. You now have a display for the audience on screen 2 and an empty desktop on screen 1.
4. Pop-up menu. Click on the Slideshow icon in the system tray to show a pop-up menu on screen 1. Use this menu to change the audience display to Full screen.
5. Send as Full screen. Alternatively you can select Full screen while the show is still on screen 1, then send it to screen 2 using Cntrl+2. Use Cntrl+1 to bring a Full screen display back to screen 1.
6. Controlling the show. The pop-up menu allows you to start and stop the slideshow. It also displays the name of the current and next image in the show. If not auto-changing slides you can click on the next image name to move forward. One drawback is that the focus (active window) moves to the slideshow on screen 2 causing the pop-up menu to close. It needs to be re-opened for each slide change.
7. Using keyboard shortcuts. While the focus is on screen 2 you can use the left and right arrow keys to move forward or back, and the Esc key to stop the show. You will lose the focus though if you click anywhere on screen 1 to do something there. To quickly return the focus to screen 2 and restore the keyboard operations, click on the Slideshow button on the taskbar.
8. Viewing the current slide. There may be times when you cannot see the show because the audience screen is behind or facing away from you. With Vista you see a thumbnail of the current slide when you hover the cursor over the taskbar button. I do not know if this can be done in XP.
9. Show on desktop. If viewing the show is a problem, an interesting option in Wildbit

Slideshow is to enable the desktop wallpaper display. You can then view the current slide as wallpaper behind the applications running on screen 1. Use whichever wallpaper layout option suits you best. I usually choose Smart.

10. Screen 2 desktop. The wallpaper is also there behind the slideshow on the desktop of screen 2. If you have to bring the show back to screen 1, perhaps to change a setting, this can give the illusion to the audience that they are still viewing the show. That may be desirable, but at the end of the show it is probably better to clear the wallpaper using the pop-up menu, or right click an empty area of desktop, select Properties or Personalize and restore your favorite wallpaper to the Desktop background.
